



Honorary International Peace Garden at Buffalo Niagara Heritage Village at Buffalo Niagara Heritage Village, located at 3755 Tonawanda Creek Road, There is an 1812 Peace Garden located just to the right of the main museum building entrance.

The garden is in a public space and can be viewed year-round at no cost. The museum and Peace Garden is in Erie County at the intersection of Tonawanda Creek and New Roads, just over the bridge from Pendleton, NY and Niagara County just across from the Erie Canal. The site serves as a trail head for the Erie Canalway Bike Trail and is in the Erie Canalway National Heritage Corridor.

The Peace Garden at Buffalo Niagara Heritage Village pops with shades of greens, reds, pinks, and yellows, and has been designed to be in bloom all season long. Some plants and trees include Virginia Sweetspire, Pepperbush, St. John's Wart, Honeysuckle, Common Ninebark, False Indigo, Goldenrod, Bluestar, Purple Coneflower, Wild Geranium, New England Aster, Dwarf Oak leaf Hydrangea, Yellow-twig dogwood, and River Birch.

The garden is maintained by museum staff and by the Erie and Niagara County Master Gardeners.
